A LETTER FROM FATHER MIKE

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

We have ended the Church celebration of the Christmas season and we are now well into what we call in the Church year, the Ordinary Time. "Ordinary Time" is hardly much of a title. But the title, properly understood, can help us grasp the intention of this season. Ordinary Time helps us to organize our thoughts, intentions and commitments toward the work Jesus gives us to do in our day-to-day lives. Every one of us needs to let the Light of Jesus shine through and permeate our daily lives.

On Wednesday, February 22nd, we begin our Lenten journey. I invite you to join me on this journey of forty days. It is a spiritual journey with Jesus as our guide and brother. Lent is a time for intense prayer and serious discipline, so that we can honestly admit and name our sinfulness, and then, repent and be forgiven. Our encounter with Jesus is always about letting go and moving forward into a transformation of our lives so that we become more like Jesus! As we journey together during Lent, I pray for you, my dear parish family, that Easter may find us closer to Jesus whose love surrounds us.

The theme for the upcoming Diocese of Madison 2012 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) is "Fountains of Living Water". The ACA goal of three million dollars for this year funds not only diocesan ministries and offices that serve the people of the Diocese of Madison but it also provides financial support for Catholic Charities (including the Catholic Multicultural Center), Camp Gray, Rural Life Ministry, and seminarian education.

Our parish met 104% of our 2011 parish goal. I personally thank you for your continued support of the ACA and congratulations to you for your generous participation last year. Our parish's ACA 2012 goal is \$40,207, which is calculated based on our parish's 2010 offertory income. All parishes in the Diocese of Madison will conduct the ACA in-pew process on the weekend of March 10-11, 2012.

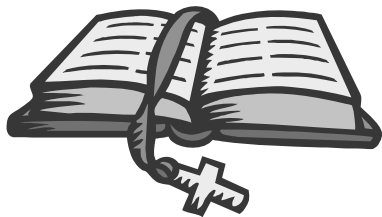

ADMINISTRATION

NO FIREARMS POLICY FOR SAINT BERNARD PARISH BUILDINGS AND CAMPUS

The Parish of Saint Bernard, Madison, Wisconsin, shall proceed to adopt a no firearms policy in all cases including the church, the rectory and the parish center buildings and the campus in general.

Saint Bernard Parish shall adopt a no firearms policy (including buildings and grounds) but will not post signage prohibiting firearms. If an employee or volunteer has a firearm in their personal vehicle while it is used for parish business, then the policy provides according to law that the firearm in the personal vehicle be unloaded and encased pursuant to the statute.

In formulating this policy, Saint Bernard Parish took into consideration the overall issues of personal safety, an individual's right to self-defense, the matter of reverence of the Eucharist and the recommendations of Catholic Mutual Group as primary insurer for Saint Bernard Parish and the Diocese of Madison.

Preschool Open House

Our Saint Bernard Catholic Preschool will be holding an Open House on **March 2, 2012** in the Parish Center Preschool Rooms 6 and 7. Our licensed program prepares children from 2-1/2 through 5 years of age.

In addition to traditional preschool programs, we offer a 4K program five mornings a week from 8:30AM-11:30AM. This program uses the Creative Curriculum and the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards.

Our schedule is flexible and this year we have offered afternoon extended care until 3:30PM Monday through Friday.

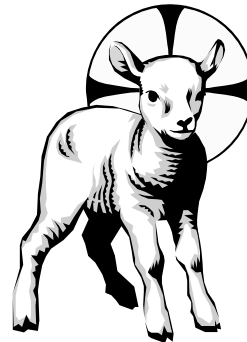

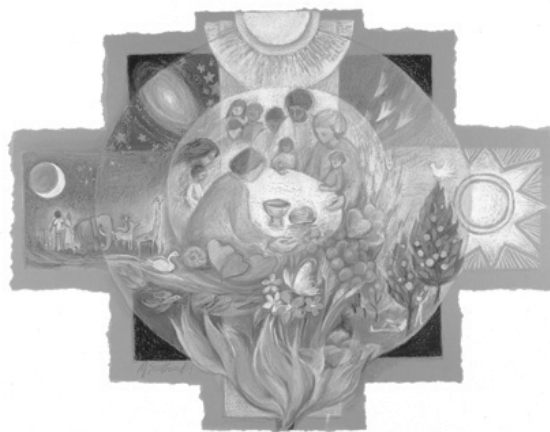
YOUTH GROUP RINGING AND CAROLING

ADULT EDUCATION - LENTEN SERIES AT SAINT BERNARD PARISH

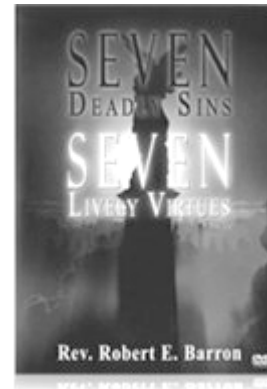
During the Lenten Season, we follow the tradition of the Church in preparing our hearts for the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. We undertake different practices to free ourselves from the bondage of sin and begin anew at Easter. Join us for the study of the "Seven Deadly Sins" series.

"Sin separates us from the love of God, but the cultivation of virtue can restore a right relationship with Him." Our Lenten Series will begin the journey from sin to sanctity with Father Robert Barron (Archdiocese of Chicago). You will find this study on the "Seven Deadly Sins" - gravely sinful habits that manifest themselves in our lives – and the "Seven Lively Virtues", which counteract the sins, is the basis for a reflective, yet practical, assessment of our lives.

Using the example of the souls on Dante's Mount Purgatory, Father Barron examines how the Seven Deadly Sins - pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust - are patterns of dysfunction, both within us and prevalent in the world today, that lead to unhappiness.

To help us overcome these patterns, Father Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition. The Seven Lively Virtues offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. Father Barron also offers practical

solutions we can adopt to strengthen our virtues and turn away from our sins.

LUKE HOUSE “EASTER BAGS”

Each of us has the ability to make a difference in another’s life. On our 2012 Lenten Journey, we, as a parish, are planning to create 200 “Easter Bags” that will be distributed to those in need at the Easter Sunday 2012 meal at Luke House.

During each of the six weeks of Lent leading up to Easter, we ask you to contribute something to put into these “Easter Bags”. There will be large baskets near the side altar of Our Lady of Perpetual Help for you to separate and place your items each week. Below is the list of items we will be collecting and date to bring each item:

Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2012

One pair of white athletic crew socks (men’s size 9-11)

Note: No women’s or children’s socks, please.

Week One, February 26, 2012

Neutral scented bath soap, 8 oz. bottle of neutral scented shampoo and one neutral deodorant size 3.25 oz.

Week Two, March 4, 2012

One individually wrapped toothbrush, one

regular size (4-6 oz) tube of toothpaste and one individually wrapped dental floss

Week Three, March 11, 2012

Individual pocket-size facial tissue packs PLUS individually wrapped unscented Chapstick and unscented hand sanitizer (4 oz. bottle)

Week Four, March 18, 2012

Individually wrapped granola bars, 4 oz. raisins, fruit roll-ups

Week Five, March 25, 2012

One bag individually wrapped Easter candy

Note: No large items, please.

Last year some people asked if they could bring all the items for a complete “Easter Bag”. The answer is “Yes”. For those who would like to do this, each bag must be identical for this Lenten Project - no more and no less. Please stop by the Parish Center to pick up the “Easter Bag” with the zip lock bags and the list. Please bring the completed “Easter Bag” to Mass before Palm Sunday.

Each weekend during this project there is a need for people to help separate these donated items into the donation baskets in the Church. The week before Palm Sunday there is a need for people to help bring all the items from the Church to the Parish Center Room 1.

Week Six, April 1, 2012 (Palm Sunday)

Please come to the Parish Center Room 1 and help fill one “Easter Bag” for Luke House.

Bags will be filled from 9:00 AM to Noon.

On Good Friday, April 6, 2012, after the Good Friday Service, help will be needed to deliver the “Easter Bags” to Luke House.
